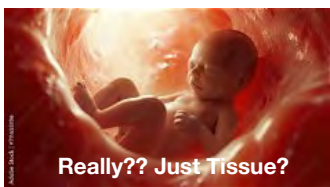

To Follow Christ is to Carry the Cross

We saw last weekend Jesus change the name of Simon to Peter, indicating that he would be the “rock” upon which His Church would be built. As we mentioned then, it was remarkable that Jesus should refer to Peter as the rock given that the rock was a symbol of God (His eternal firmness and immutability). Jesus Himself is the rock foundation of the Church, Peter and his successors, are His visible head here on earth.



Today's Gospel reminds us that although the Church has a divine origin, it is still made up – from the Pope to the last of its members – of weak men and women. As such, she is susceptible to sin. Peter who was so “exalted” last week, shows today

his weakness. He was not always inspired by the Father and at times was capable of being even a source of temptation for Jesus. Peter thought (for a moment) that he knew more than Jesus and would not allow that Jesus suffer the humiliation of the cross. Throughout the Gospels, we see that one of the temptations for Jesus was to avoid the cross and seek our salvation some other way. Up to the end, in the agony in the garden, Jesus in His human nature wished to avoid the cross to the point of sweating blood. Only His desire to do the Father's will kept Him capable of accepting the cross. So, when Peter suggested that “no such thing would happen to Him”, Jesus called him Satan (the one who tempts with lies) and rebuked him. Although Peter was still

the rock, he would need to learn humility and the docility to the Holy Spirit to seek the Father’s will in all things. That gift of the Holy Spirit will come to him after Pentecost.

In the second part of the Gospel, Jesus explains to his disciples - and to us - the need to follow Him “taking up our cross.” Whoever seeks to follow Christ without the cross is not really following Jesus but rather a fantasy. He goes on to explain that it is in giving of our life that we save it and by trying to hang on to our life that we lose it. We see this in the joy of generosity and self-giving. Jesus gives us the extreme example of this in pouring himself out on the cross for love of us.

Finally, Jesus reminds us that there is only one thing in life that is worth everything, and that is reaching heaven. We may have everything else life has to offer here on earth, wealth, power or health, but if we lose our soul, it will not be worth it.
